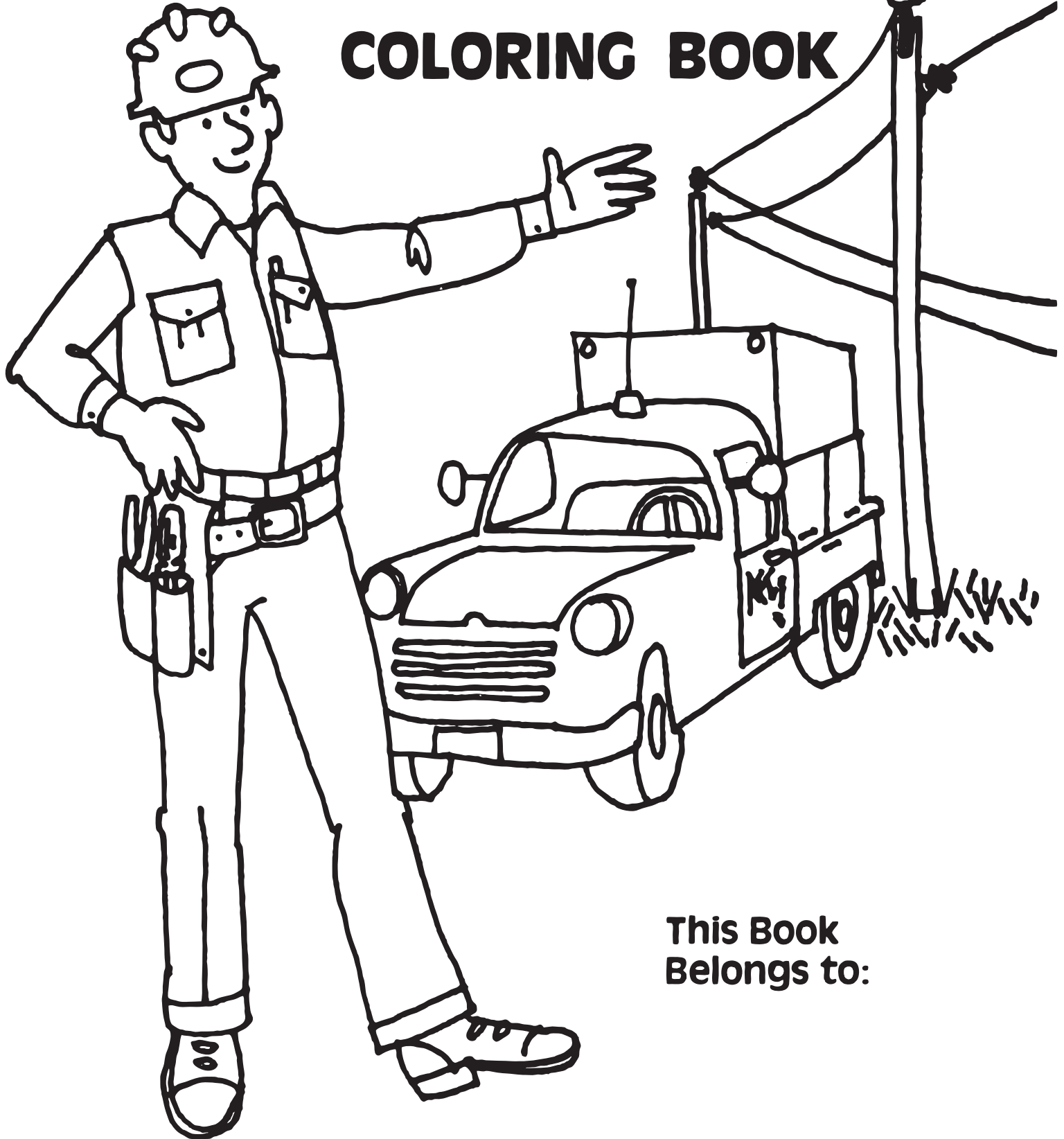


# MR. LINEMAN ELECTRIC SAFETY

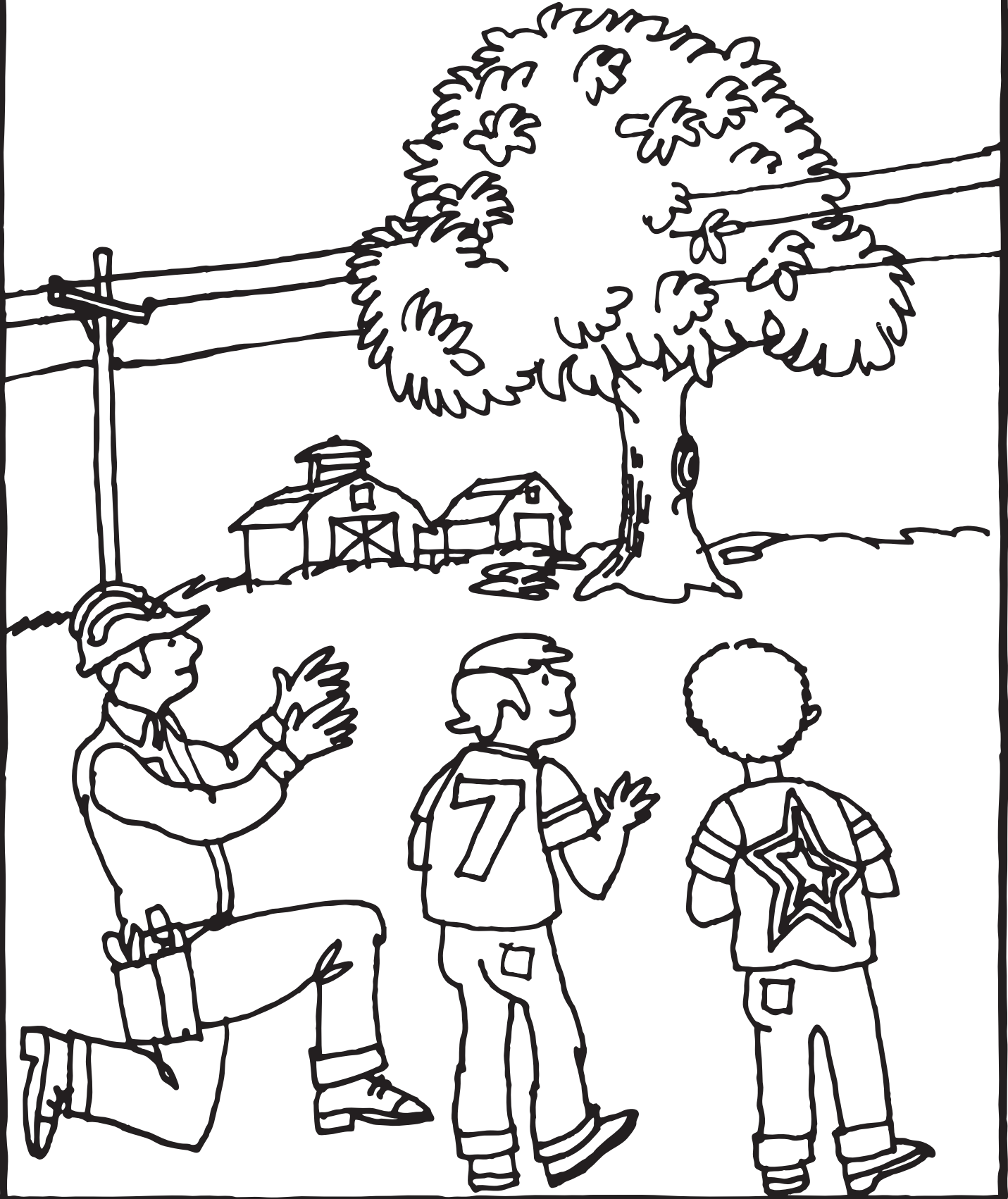

Your rural electric system is concerned about your family's safety. We hope this book will help promote electric safety in and around your home.

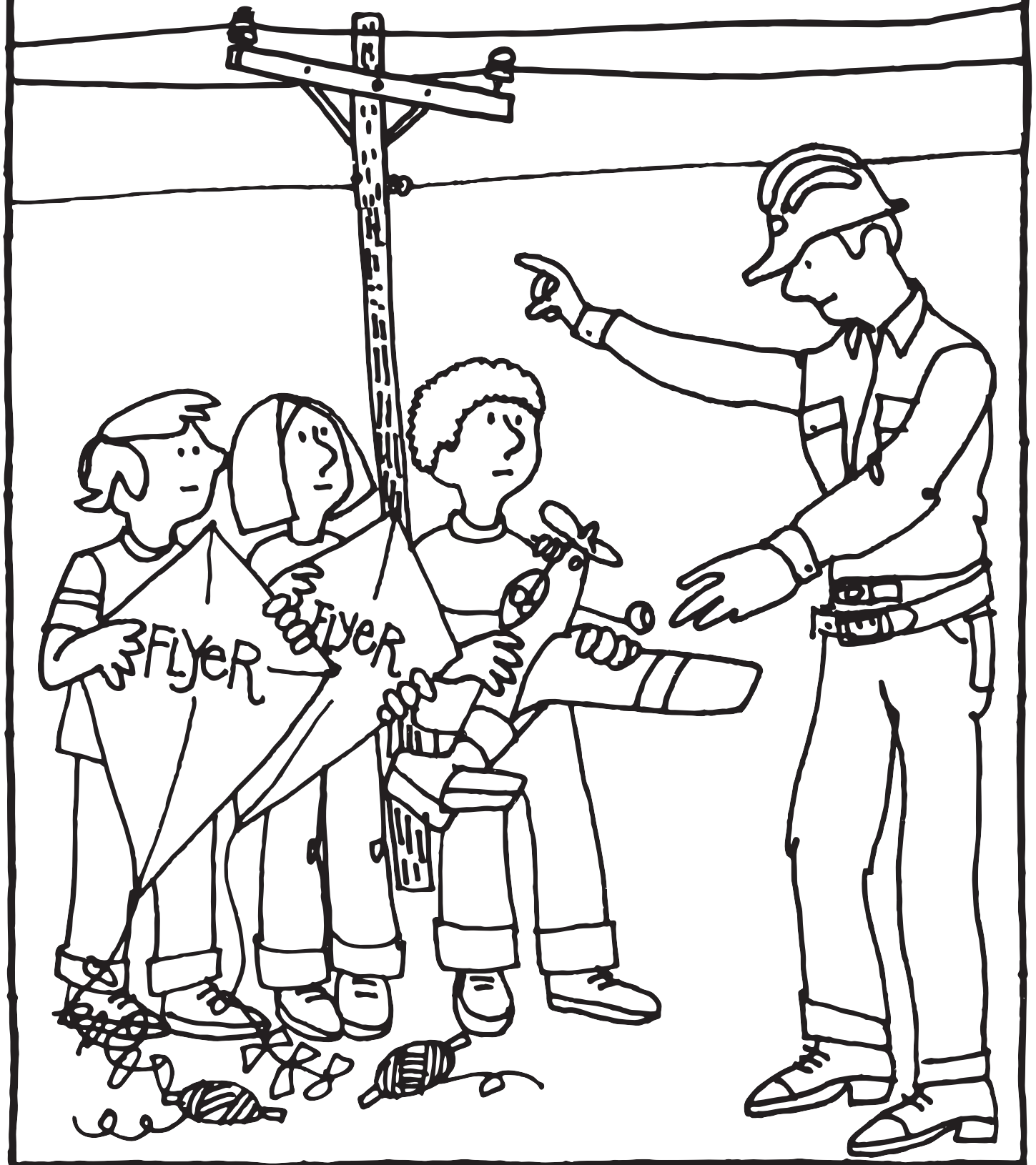
Never climb on the poles that hold up the electric wires on your street. They are dangerous. I am carefully trained to work on those poles, and only do so when I must.



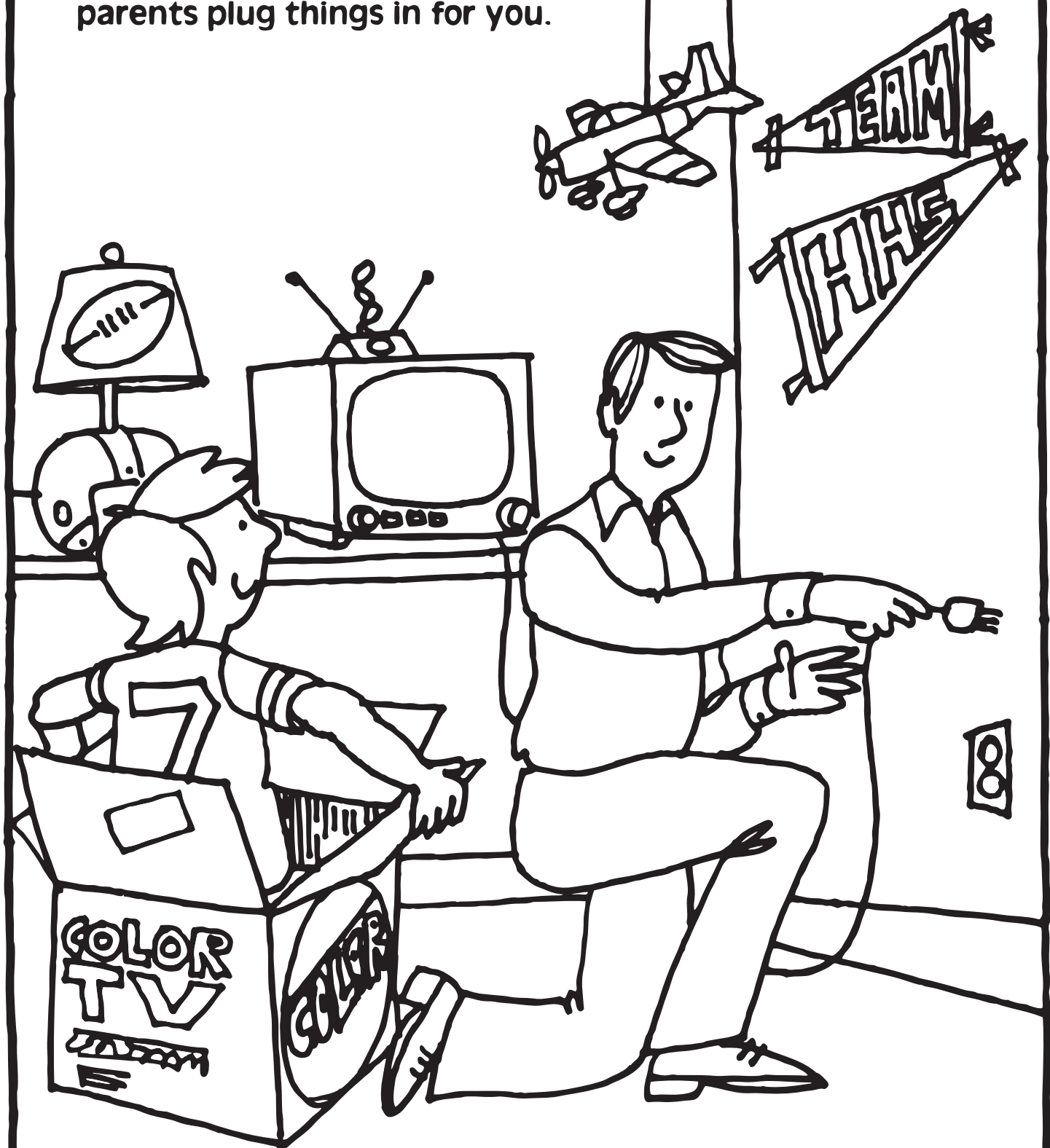
Never climb in trees that have electric wires running through or near them. You might get badly burned.



Never fly kites or model airplanes near electric wires.



Never put anything into electric sockets. Let your parents plug things in for you.

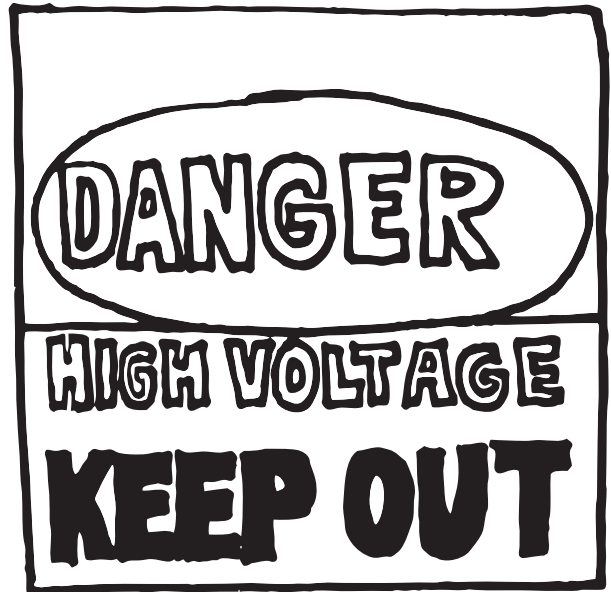


Never touch anything that runs on electricity when you are in the bathtub or swimming pool, or when you are wet, or when you are standing in water, because you can easily be hurt very badly.



Watch for these very important danger signs.  
If you see them — stay away!

These signs are used where there are large  
amounts of electricity. Never enter gates or  
fences where you see these important signs.
